Prague is both the capital and largest city in the **Czech Republic** and also one of the most beautiful cities in Europe. **Prague** is called the City of a hundred spires, the Golden City, the Mother of Cities or the **Heart of Europe**. The extensive historic centre of Prague has been included in the **UNESCO** list of World Heritage Sites since 1992. During the year, many tourists come to Prague to visit the places of interest and enjoy sightseeing.

Czech University of Life Sciences in Prague (CZU) is a public university that was founded in its current form in 1952. CZU comprises six faculties/colleges of which the Faculty of Economics and Management (FEM) is the largest economic faculty in the Czech Republic with nearly 9,000 enrolled students.
